

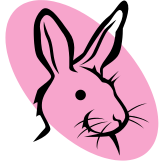
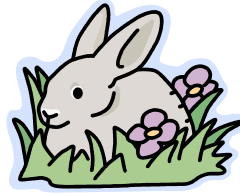

### DID YOU EVER SEE A BUNNY?

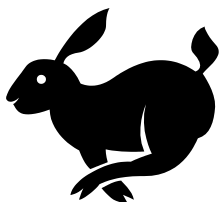
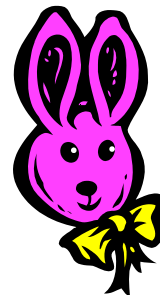
(*tune of Did you Ever See a Lassie*)
